Key Questions

- What's one idea from the message that really stood out to you? Why did this grab your attention?

- What steps might you need to take to begin to represent God's light in dark places?

Optional Questions – If needed, include one or more of these scriptures and questions to extend your conversation.

- Read Matthew 5:13 aloud. Salt is used to preserve and pull out flavor. What does it mean for a believer to lose his or her "saltiness" in the world?
- Read Matthew 5:14-16. This is where the name for TheCity.church comes from. What do you think it looks like to be a "City on a Hill" in every day life?
- Read Romans 10:12-14 aloud. This verse shows the role we have in representing Jesus to the world around those so that they can place their trust in Him. Is there a person, or multiple people, in your life that you believe the Lord has placed in your life to represent Jesus to? If so, how are you trying to demonstrate God's love to them?
- What challenges or fears do you face when it comes to telling others about Jesus or inviting someone to sit with you at church?
