Getting Started

- Highs and Lows: Ask your group what their high point and low point of the week
- Icebreaker: If You Could Visit Any Country, Where Would You Go? Why?

Setup

- Welcome & Prayer
- Watch Recap Video

Key Questions

- **Review:** Did you pray the prayer, "Lead Me, Place Me, Shine Through Me" this past week? Did God show up in any specific way?
- **Recap:** What's one idea that stood out to you from this Sunday's message? Why did that stand out to you?
- **Big Idea:** "Righteous Anger Is Being Angry At What Makes God Angry"
 - On Sunday, Pastor Blake shared that we being angry is not a sin. There
 is a difference between righteous anger and human, sinful anger.
 - Why do we as Christians often shy away from talking about anger?
 - What are key differences between righteous anger and human anger?
 - Pastor Blake shared different things we have permission to be angry about.
 - Religious Clutter
 - What does it mean to be angry about religious clutter?
 - Prejudice
 - Why is prejudice something God is angry with?
 - How are we as Christians called to respond to prejudice?
 - Injustice
 - Have you ever witnessed injustice in your life? Would you share?
 - Overlooking Children
 - What does it mean to be angry at overlooking children?

- **Next Steps:** "Get Angry Like Jesus"
 - o Do you see any of the 4 things we talked about happening in or around your life?
 - o What would it look like if you got angry about those things? How could you affect change?
